WHAT IS THE LONDON FOREIGN STUDIES PROGRAM?

The Government Department's London Foreign Study Program takes place each year during the fall term. It focuses on international relations and comparative politics in affiliation with the London School of Economics.

- Participate in unique educational excursions like trips to the British Library to examine the Magna Carta and tours of Parliament with lawmakers from the Commons and the Lords
- Immerse yourself in cultural experiences with performances at Wigmore Hall and the Globe Theatre
- Explore England's surrounding beauty with a Thames River Boat voyage to Greenwich and sightseeing outings to Bath, Stonehenge, and Cambridge
- Expand your knowledge of comparative politics and international relations in courses taught by London School of Economics and Dartmouth professors
- Experience life as a London School of Economics student by living in a flat with access to libraries and common rooms

PREREQUISITES

Any two of the following courses:

Government 4, Government 5, or Government 6

COURSES TAUGHT BY LSE FACULTY

- **GOVERNMENT 90:** Government, Policy and Politics in the EU
- **GOVERNMENT 91:** Foreign Policy Analysis

Students receive one credit per course and learn from world class London School of Economics instructors.

SEMINAR TAUGHT BY DARTMOUTH PROFESSOR

- **GOVERNMENT 92:** Economic Statecraft and International Relations taught by Professor Mastanduno (Example from Fall 2021)

The third-course credit is a seminar taught by the resident Dartmouth faculty director. The topic is typically within the fields of comparative politics, international relations, or political theory.
